

Heart to heart

Animal communicator Pea Horsley connects with an older cat named Moppet who has some important messages for her owner.

Seventeen-year-old Moppet has suffered from kidney disease for many years, but has recently got progressively worse. Her owner, Jacqueline Massey of Maldon, Essex, is understandably concerned about her cat's health and happiness. She says: "I would like to understand what is best for Moppet, what she wants, and how I can do my best for her. I've had her

since she was a kitten and I want to make sure she knows how much she means to me."

With this in mind, animal communicator Pea got to work, establishing a connection with Moppet using just her name, age and a couple of photos. Pea says: "Moppet comes across as a proud, gentle, quiet and sweet cat who has a mind of her own and her own views on what she likes and dislikes.

"Before she got sick she used to

take great pride in her appearance. She is unable to keep herself clean now and showed a prominent boney spine. She loves it when you stroke her front paws and speak admiring words to her. She also has a sneaky side to her nature (in a nice way) and I feel like she plans how she's going to get her own way.

"Moppet pictured having 'her chair' in the conservatory where she would bask in the sunshine and living with a cat who is black. She's never been a particularly active cat and prefers home comforts – particularly lying on the duvet towards the end of the bed. Moppet gives me the impression she's been feeling ill for the past five years."

Pea then went on to ask Moppet questions from her owner Jacqueline.

Q What's your life been like?

'The very best life. Full of love, drama, kindness, warm fires and the food that I've liked. It has been an adventure. I have enjoyed adventuring with you.'

Q How do you feel?

'I am feeling bright. Light. Not miserable. I have contentment in the smallness of my life.'

Q Is there anything you want to say to your feline friends?

To Sweep – I do love him. Keep him safe. He is quite

wild and unruly. To Safie – she will learn to cope on her own. It will be good for her to experience herself fully.'

Q Is there anything you need me to do?

Yes, trust in your heart. You can see I am ok. Struggling, yes a little, but life is about getting older, frail, sick. This is the cycle of life. Just a natural process for the soul to experience time and again.'

Q I want her to know she is beautiful and I adore her – she will always by my best friend and soulmate.

'I know this. Thank you. We have a special link, it is true.'

Q Please tell her I love her with all my heart and always will.

'Love is unconditional and never ending.' Pea says: "Moppet accompanied this message with a picture of her nose – she touches you with her nose."

Owner Jacqueline says: "Pea's responses made me cry as this is so much my beloved cat. Pea captured the essence of Moppet. Her proudness, her beauty, her unconditional love and the special bond that we have. Everything Pea shared was my dear Moppet; her life, her adventures, her feline companions, her favourite things and the way she touches me with her nose. It was so good to know that she had loved her life, and was content and happy.


